

English tips and hints

* Reading a variety of different genres is imperative and will give pupils a wider knowledge of vocabulary e.g. fiction, non-fiction and poetry books. The 11+ comprehension exercise could focus on a classic or a contemporary passage.



- An important skill in performing well in comprehension exercises is having a good understanding of inference. This can be developed by asking questions about the text your child is reading.

❖ Encourage your child to find clues in the text to support their reasoning. This helps when answering questions about the extract and will ensure they are verifying their answers. Children need to act like detectives when answering questions!
